46th Avenue Construction under way!

Big orange cones. Heavy Machinery. Detours and road closures?! The 46 Avenue recreational trail and road improvement projects are underway! With a relatively short construction schedule running from January to June, the project will result in big improvements to the 46th Avenue corridor. What are these big improvements?

- 46th Avenue Road and Gutter

From the 50th Street bridge on the east, to 61st Lane on the west, 46th Ave will be completed re-done. Approximately 3 to 4 inches of the old roadway surface will be removed and replaced with a new asphalt roadway and curb. The road will remain a two-lane road. Storm-water gutters, curbs, and ADA ramps along 46th will be repaired/replaced as needed.

- Sidewalk

The median sidewalk that stretches throughout the entire median of 46th Ave will be a ten foot wide trail. The trail/street crosswalks will be ADA accessable. a new RRFB device will be installed at the crosswalk of 60th St. and 46th Ave. Benches, picnic tables and trash cans will be installed along the trail.


- Trail Spur

The Lake Lori Town property will be connected to the 46th Avenue Trail by a connecting trail spur along the east side of the 60th street drainage easement.

As our readers may remember from our last newsletter, this project was the culmination of years of advocacy and negotiation with Pinellas County. The Town greatly appreciates the County's commitment to improving the daily lives of our residents!
