

Our specific abilities include fully equipped and staffed departments to provide electronic subsurface utility designation and ground penetrating radar (GPR), along with non-destructive vacuum subsurface utility locating and mapping.

- Quality Level D (QL D) information derived solely from existing records or verbal recollections.
 All reports and/or drawings based on information acquired may be part of the required deliverables.
- Quality Level C (QL C) information obtained by surveying and plotting visible above ground
 utility features and by using professional judgment in correlating the information to Quality
 Level D information.
- Quality Level B (QL B) information obtained through the application of appropriate surface
 geophysical methods to identify the existence and approximate horizontal position of
 subsurface utilities. "Quality Level B" data will be reproducible by surface geophysics at any
 point of their depiction. This information is surveyed to applicable tolerances and reduced onto
 plan documents.
- Quality Level A (QL A) information obtained by the actual exposure (or verification of previously exposed and surveyed utilities) of subsurface utilities, using (typically) minimally intrusive excavation equipment to determine their precise horizontal and vertical positions, as well as their other utility attributes. This information will be surveyed and reduced onto plan documents. Accuracy is typically set at 15mm vertical and to applicable horizontal survey and mapping standards.

The stated guidelines were developed from the ASCE Standard 38-02 Standard Guideline for the Collection and Depiction of Existing Utility Data. GFY adopted these guidelines once they were published and have continued to refine the process to provide the most accurate underground utility mapping possible.

GFY employs some of the most experienced utility locating staff in the industry. We have made a practice of hiring experienced utility construction personnel to perform the utility designation and location. By using these experienced employees, they bring their utility construction background and knowledge of underground utility construction, which makes their efforts to designate and locate the underground utilities much more efficient.

Our familiarity with other governing agencies such as the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and all of the local city governments within Pinellas County greatly enhances our ability to overcome permitting issues while working in the streets and right of ways. Because of our many years of GEORGE F. YOUNG

experience providing SUE we have an intimate relationship with all the Utility Agency Owners that operate and maintain local and private utilities within Pinellas County. Having this relationship gives us the ability to coordinate the need for retrieving records and information such as marked up plans, maps and as built record drawings much more efficient. We maintain these relationships by attending all the local monthly utility group meetings as well as the bi-annual FDOT District 7 Utility Liaison Conferences.

GIS

GIS services provided by GFY are more than exporting engineering and construction plans into GIS formats. We offer a unique GIS service that is modeled specifically for small(er) municipalities. We refer to this as GISaaS or, GIS as a Service. Specifically, this is a service that we offer to augment your inhouse GIS with asset data collection, digitizing, data-management, systems, and solutions training and consulting on an as-needed basis. For most of our GISaaS clients we also provide a full-service GIS that includes a hosting option for the client's GIS on dedicated cloud based Esri enterprise GIS servers. Hosted data is served out to the 'client-owned' ArcGIS Online platform subscription where GFY develops and manages user-focused web and mobile accessible GIS data, maps, and applications. These are then made available to the client's administration, operations, and (as warranted) to their citizens for public engagement. We also make available custom GIS tools for operations to interact with the GIS to change attribution or create markups to identify needed revisions. Meanwhile GFY remains as a valued resource for data entry, and data conversion as system mature over time.

Discussed the comments and requirements with the property owner and contractor.

This was a SWFWMD stormwater facility inspection and certification. The Town's main facility building, and park area stormwater system required inspection and a certification to the water management

district that the system was still in compliance with the code and functioning as designed. The system consisted of multiple ponds, filtration system and outfall to the intercoastal waterways.

GFY also assisted the Town with the MS4 permitting with the FDEP. We are currently working on a presentation to the town council and the towns facility staff on erosion control and best management practices. This is a requirement of the MS4 permitting.

The project consisted of approximately 2,325 feet of pavement, pedestrian, bicycle, sidewalk, stormwater infrastructure, and water quality improvements to 20th Street NW between West Bay Drive and Ezelle Avenue in Largo, Florida. GFY reviewed questionnaire responses given by approximately 60 residents, existing traffic data, evaluated the existing stormwater system for needed repairs, and prepared a preliminary analysis report, comparing four alternatives and anticipated costs, and providing a final recommendation of which alternative to progress to design. The GFY team assisted the City with community outreach, which consisted of virtual public meetings – detailing the design elements and allowing further input from residents. This project's challenges





included a constrained right-of-way, a narrow shoulder, and substandard lane widths, and the need to accommodate a 10' multi-use path on one side of the roadway.

The GFY team completed a design consisting of two-10' travel lanes, a 5' sidewalk on the west side and a 10' multi-use trail along the east side of 20th Street NW. The design was completed without any major utility relocations and provided a "complete street" concept for all users including motorists, pedestrians and bicyclists.

The City of Oldsmar wanted to extend Burbank Road from its current dead-end (located south of the CSX Railroad) north to E. Douglas Road through additional M-1 zoned properties for approximately 1,200 LF. The project consisted of new roadside drainage, sanitary, reclaimed water and conduit for future development. The project also included an at-grade railroad crossing with a box culvert on the south side of CSX and a pipe culvert on the north side. The City wanted to continue the typical section of the roadway north of the CSX Railroad with the option of having a trail on one side. GFY was responsible for the design of the railroad crossing up to 10' from the centerline of the tracks. The actual track crossing and rail grade warning devices were designed by the CSX's GEC. Our team worked closely with this consultant, along with the City of Oldsmar to manage and coordinate the design efforts. As an additional offering GFY collected periodic site aerials via our drone operations.

The project consisted of completing a Citywide Assessment of all the road pavement condition to prepare a Pavement Management Program for the repair and preservation of all city roads.

Our crews gathered field data for the determination of the conditions of the pavement and the data was analyzed, processed, and uploaded to a custom prepared GIS tool created by our GIS department for the City.

The data gathered was used to develop a pavement condition index (PCI) for all the roads under the City

jurisdiction and maintenance. A multi-year pavement management plan that will allow the City to apply for several grants with FDOT for the funding of the pavement repairs was prepared as part of this contract.

The GIS tool prepared by GFY allows the city to post a copy of the pavement management plan map to the City's website and residents can go to the website and identify which fiscal



year their roads are planned to be resurfaced. This will allow the City of Arcadia to eliminate many of the calls received daily from residents asking when their roads are going to be paved.

The City of Gulfport desired to create an inventory of their public works sidewalks and ADA (Americans disability Act) sidewalk ramps. The need for the inventory was multifold and included developing a mappable inventory to aid in the understanding of assets for capital planning and on-going asset maintenance.

The GIS platform was selected to promote spatial integration of the inventory with other municipal public works and utility assets and to take advantage of the readily available nature of GIS through web and mobile GIS mapping interfaces. GIS also makes this inventory readily accessible for in-field condition assessment.



The development of the sidewalk and ADA ramp asset inventory involved manual digitizing of assets from areal imagery into a GIS using ESRI Server and ArcPro solutions. "Map Services" were then published from the GIS Servers to ArcGIS Online and web and mobile enabled maps and applications were developed for client and engineering access. Plans are in the works to utilize this inventory to conduct staged in-field condition assessments capturing condition and details about the sidewalk and ramp assets and details and photos for and deficiencies discovered. This condition information can then be used to aid in securing funding and engineering design and construction efforts for improvements and maintenance efforts.



The project consisted of converting a two-lane rural

dirt road to an asphalt paved road including geotechnical investigations, stormwater and environmental analysis and design, utility relocations and upgrading, as well as analyzing and designing two intersections along the newly constructed 12th Avenue.

The project presented challenges due to limited right of way, a major conveyance ditch running parallel to 12th Avenue along the east side and utility conflicts including a water main and force main. The City also requested installing a new gravity sewer line which proved difficult to connect to the adjacent sanitary system.

Our team was able to accommodate the two-lane pavement and conveyance swales without impacting the private properties along the west side of the of 12th Avenue or negatively impacting the conveyance ditch along the east side of the road. The ingenious GFY design was aligible for a parmit exemption from the Southwest Florida Water Management.



eligible for a permit exemption from the Southwest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD).

The GFY team successfully tackled the design of the new gravity sewer line along the project that proved unfeasible to connect to the sanitary system, to the east of the project, due to the existing ditch and culvert invert. GFY survey and SUE crew's availability from our local Lakewood Ranch office were leveraged to assist our design team with an alternative solution. Collaborating with City personnel, our team quickly determined the most efficient connection point for the proposed sanitary sewer. Our team's holistic approach and early constructability review were key in addressing this challenge without adversely affecting the project schedule and budget.

The project was funded through the FDOT Small County Opportunity Project (SCOP) grant. Constant coordination was required with FDOT. All submittals were made to FDOT through their Electronic Review Comment (ERC) portal for each design phase.

The project was completed four months ahead of the FDOT Schedule due date of December of 2021. The project was completed within budget and no change orders were issued.

The City was fined by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection for a lack of Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) as part of their Municipal Separated Storm Sewer System (MS4) permit that included the operations of the Municipal Airport. Our team completed a review and assessment of all airport operations and ended up preparing an entirely new SWPPP for the airport. As part of the SWPPP our team prepared standard operating procedures (SOPs) for avoiding and handling spills, we created of Record/Project Manager: The scope of the project included the addition of a left

turn lane and a right turn lane to the west leg of the intersection. As part of this project, and at the request of Highlands County (the maintaining agency) we incorporated the replacement of the entire strain pole assembly including all signal heads, control cabinet, cables, and loops. Signal timings were reviewed and adjusted to accommodate the new left and right turn movements under the existing signal operating plan (SOP) 9. In addition to the signalization plans, Mr. Traverso provided QA/QC services to the roadway design components of the plan set and reviewed the plans for compliance with District One preferences

The project consisted of two retail structures, Annex A and Annex B, on Westshore Boulevard in Tampa, Florida. Annex A is an approximately 4,000 SF single-story structure and is constructed of load-bearing exterior masonry walls with structural steel joist and beam roof framing. The building is founded upon the existing foundation system that was left in-place after demolishing the existing building within the new building footprint. Annex B is an approximately 10,000 SF, two-story structure and is constructed of load-bearing exterior masonry walls and structural steel beam second floor and roof framing. The building is founded on new shallow spread and continuous concrete foundations. The structural components of each building were analyzed using 3-D analysis software. BIM software was also used to model the structures which allowed for collaboration with architectural and MEP disciplines to perform clash detection prior to construction. As Engineer of Record, Mr. Lunsford was responsible for overseeing all design and detailing aspects of the project. The project was reviewed at multiple stages of design with the design team to ensure all project and code requirements were met.

The project consists of (2) new buildings, Lower Division Classrooms and Chapel building, for Berkeley Preparatory School in Tampa, Florida. The Lower Division Classroom building is an approximately 30,000 SF two-story structure. The structural system consists of exterior load-bearing masonry for gravity and lateral loading. The elevated second floor is structural steel beam and concrete and steel deck framing, and the roof is structural steel beam and steel deck framing. The building is founded on two different foundation systems, traditional shallow foundations and deep foundations. To alleviate the effects of differential settlement





between the two foundation systems, an expansion joint was provided at a natural break in the building. The Chapel building is single-story and approximately 7,500 SF in area. The construction is exterior load-bearing masonry walls with structural steel beam and deck for the low roof and structural steel truss framing for the vaulted high roof. Mr. Lunsford is the Engineer of Record for this project and led a team of structural engineers to provide the design for all structural components of the project.

Tab 5: Approach to Handling of Potential Projects

Proposed Project Approach

While working with various municipal project managers for the past 50 years, we have developed a project approach that keeps task orders on a systematic track so that each step of the process is efficient, on time, and successful. In some cases, the Design Memorandum may present alternative solutions. In this case, the Design Memorandum will evaluate the advantages and disadvantages of each alternative, as well as present a preliminary construction cost opinion for each alternative. After Town staff has reviewed a draft memorandum, the Design Memorandum will be finalized and presented with the recommended and approved alternative based upon the Town's evaluation of the advantages, disadvantages and potential costs.

Preparation of Plans and Specifications: Preparation of Plans and Specifications: GFY will proceed with the approved design as follows:

Using survey information obtained by the Town or from GFY in-house field survey crews, construction plans will be prepared with plan and profile sheets in AutoCAD Civil 3D format at a horizontal scale of 1" = 40'. Once the horizontal layout is defined, vertical design will commence and include designing the pipe to a grade line, determining the locations of utility conflicts, resolving utility conflicts and establishing locations of improvements.

Plans would be submitted to the Town for review and comment at the 30%, 60%, 90% and 100% levels of effort. The methods of construction will be identified, as well as materials of construction, lengths of runs, fittings, and stationing.

Technical specifications for the work will be prepared and combined with Town front-end documents to meet the requirements of both the Town and other regulatory permitting agencies.

Specifications will be provided to the Town for review at the 90% and 100% levels of completion.

Engineer's Opinion of Probable Construction Cost: Once the Town's review staff approves the design and construction methods after the 60% submittal, GFY will provide an opinion of probable construction cost at the 90% and 100% levels of effort. This will be provided to the City with the above-mentioned deliverables.

Bidding and Award

GFY will prepare bid sets and issue necessary addenda for the project, conduct a pre-bid conference and assist the Town in the bid opening. After the bid opening, bids will be examined to determine the lowest bidder who meets the required technical qualifications for undertaking the work. Based upon our findings, GFY will recommend award to the lowest qualified bidder. If necessary, we will also assist the Town in resolving any bid protests.

Construction Phase Services

Even as GFY is capable of providing both construction management and on-site resident inspection services, we recognize that the Town has a qualified construction department; however, GFY can provide the following:


