JANUARY 2020 MONTHLY STATS

The Department continues to stay busy with Patrolling and Crime Prevention initiatives. Members of the Department responded to 96 calls for service in addition to proactive crime prevention and code related activities. Officers completed 156 police reports and supplements this month.

Our Patrol Division continues to make a presence in our residential and business district, proactively patrolling and interacting with the public.

Our community compliance / policing Officer Beltran continues to balance his duties with crime prevention and ordinance complaints; this month he investigated a total of 58 code violations. Ofc Beltran closed out 13 violations which carried over from the month of December. He assisted patrol on several days this month due to training, call outs, and vacations. He worked 10 calls for service and completed 22 reports and supplements (see the attached stat sheet for activity).

Detective Tucker continues to follow up on those Felony cases which are initiated by patrol and transfer over for follow up. Det Tucker started this month with 21 cases and ended with 16. He completed 19 supplement reports and conducted 5 interviews (see the attached stat sheet for activity).

We have continued our snipe sign enforcement, removing signage which is advertising or not permitted specifically on the weekends. The areas in which most of the signage is found are utility poles, rights-of-way, and medians along 54th Ave and 46th Ave North.

Members of the Department continued to attend State, County and local meeting with other law enforcement and community partners.

We continue loading all training documents and certificates associated for all personnel in Power DMS as a long-term training, tracking and alerting module. Officer Jailer Diaz has assumed a new role as the agency's Professional Standards Officer overseeing the accreditation and training for all personnel in the department.

Our community policing event *Coffee with a Cop* was held on January 28, 2020 at St. Pete Bagel. Ofc Beltran also participated in the Tornado Watch Drill at the Church of the Nazarene Child Development Center. Ofc Beltran also participated in the annual Homeless Outreach event.

KCPD Community Policing & Code Compliance Stats January 2020

CPO Beltran Hernandez

CPO Beltran focused on common ordinance violations such as tall grass (Code 30-106), Improper/prohibited storage (30-57), unregistered/inoperable vehicles (30-81), no permit pulled (18-1) and prohibited signage (snipe signs in right of way 66-194) for the majority of ordinance violations for this month.

CPO Beltran also covered the road for patrol during this month, as well as attended multiple meetings and planning/coordinating events.

CPO Beltran participated in the annual Homeless Outreach Event on 01/23/2020 from 1200-0300 hours. During this event, two transient subjects were located and agreed to participate in the event by completing a survey. After completing the survey, the participants were offered services and transport to shelters, such as Pinellas Hope and Safe Harbor. The participants were also given PSTA bus passes for completing the surveys.

CPO Beltran conducted a Tornado Watch Drill at the Church Of The Nazarene Child Development Center on 01/29/2020. The Great Tornado Drill is a County-wide event and is conducted at the same time at multiple schools throughout Pinellas. CPO Beltran spoke with the children about the importance of listening to and following the orders of their teachers during any drill, as well as demonstrating the duck and cover technique to the children so they would know what to do in case severe weather hit.

CPO Beltran hosted a *Coffee with A Cop* community policing event on 01/28/2020 at our local St Pete Bagel. The event was a success, with a moderately large turnout. Multiple community contacts and positive interactions with citizens were made at this event. CPO Beltran has also been planning and coordinating for the *Casting with A Cop* event scheduled for 02/29/2020.

CPO Beltran has been utilizing the Polaris, police truck and police bicycle during the duties of his patrol and continues to work on and update our current Business

Watch List. He has also been working on creating an Inoperable/ Unregistered/ Derelict Vehicle Sticker Warning program to place on vehicles in violation of ordinance 30-81.
