FEBRUARY 2020 MONTHLY STATS

On February 20, our Agency was awarded Initial CFA Accreditation by the Commission for Florida Law Enforcement Accreditation (CFA) at the Florida Police Accreditation Coalition conference in St Augustine, FL. The entire Agency worked together to achieve this long term goal: every one contributed an important piece, ranging from outstanding on-site assessment interviews, flawless on the spot equipment inspections, providing suitable proofs for Standards, and creating, reviewing and arranging all paperwork and policies so that they met or exceeded the Commission's standards. Special thanks goes to Jeff Owens, our Accreditation Manager, for volunteering his time and expertise, and to our Mayor, Wanda Dudley, and our Town Manager, for traveling to St Augustine to take part in the review and ceremony granting our Agency our accredited status.

During February, the Department continued to stay busy with Patrolling and Crime Prevention initiatives. Members of the Department responded to 96 calls for service in addition to proactive crime prevention and code related activities. Officers completed 118 police reports and supplements this month.

Our Patrol Division continued to make a presence in our residential and business district, proactively patrolling and interacting with the public.

Our community compliance / policing Officer Beltran continued to balance his duties with crime prevention and ordinance complaints; this month he investigated a total of 49 code violations and issued 3 ordinance citations. He also assisted patrol on several days this month due to training, call outs, and vacations. He worked 10 calls for service and completed 14 reports and supplements (see the attached stat sheet for activity).

We have continued our snipe sign enforcement, removing signage which is advertising or not permitted specifically on the weekends. The areas in which most of the signage is found are utility poles, rights-of-way, and medians along 54th Ave and 46th Ave North.

Our community policing event *Casting with a Cop* was held on Lake Paul. There was a great turn out and support from families, local businesses and associations: Morphmart Reptile Shop donated cricket bait, St Pete Moose Lodge 1145 cooked lunch and donated raffle prizes, and Volunteer Dick Laneau instructed a large group of children on how to fish.

Detective Tucker continues to follow up on those Felony cases which are initiated by patrol and transfer over for follow up. Det Tucker started this month with 16 cases and ended with 16. He completed 19 supplement reports and requested that 5 subpoenas be issued (see the attached stat sheet for activity). In addition, as the beginning of the month, he attended an IHIA Homicide Investigations Course and a Financial Crimes Conference sponsored by the Inspector General and the State Attorney's Office, both held in Tampa.

KCPD Community Policing & Code Compliance Stats

CPO Beltran Hernandez

On 02/29/2020 the CP Unit held our *Casting with A Cop* event at Lake Paul. The event was a great success, and we utilized this time to make a positive impact on our community and talk to folks about the “*Lock It or Loose it*” and “*See Something, Say Something*” crime prevention and safety campaigns. Moose Lodge donated fishing poles for raffling and cooked hotdogs for lunch, local business Morph Mart donated over 1000 crickets for bait, and Volunteer Dick Laneau provided poles and equipment. A great thanks goes to these members in our community that contributed their time and resources to assure the event was the best it could be.

CPO Beltran attended a Fraud Prevention Training forum hosted in Gulfport. The training provided insightful information on the ongoing targeting of seniors in identity theft and other fraudulent crimes. CPO Beltran will utilize this information and present it during neighborhood watch meetings at 55+ Communities in Town, to inform and prevent any resident from being a victim of these crimes.

CPO Beltran has been preparing for *Biking with a Badge* to be held on 03/24/2020 and has ordered over 100 bicycle helmets as well as located public speakers for the event.

On 02/29/2020 CPO Beltran responded to an Assist Other Agency call to a restaurant on 66th St N. The neighboring business owner reported that fumes from the restaurant were leaking into his business, making him feel sick. After further investigation the owner of the restaurant revealed that he had been cooking using charcoal inside of the restaurant. Fire and Rescue utilized a CO2 scanner in the restaurant and discovered high levels of carbon monoxide. The restaurant and neighboring businesses were then evacuated. Pinellas Park Building Inspector Ken Lubecki and Fire Inspector Chris Astleford arrived on scene,

spoke with the owner and shutdown the business, placing an “Unfit for Occupancy” notice on the front of the building.

CPO Beltran focused on common ordinance violations such as tall grass (Code 30-106), improper/prohibited storage (30-57), unregistered/inoperable vehicles (30-81), no permit pulled (18-1) and prohibited signage (snipe signs in right of way 66-194) for the majority of ordinance violations for this month.

CPO Beltran responded to a call for a dog at large along 43rd Ave N and 65th Way N on 02/10/2020. The dog was reportedly running up to pedestrians in an aggressive manner, barking and growling at them. After arriving on scene and investigating the incident further, CPO Beltran issued an NTA/Ordinance Violation citation for dog at large to the owner.

CPO Beltran issued an NTA/Ordinance Violation citation to a business on 59th Ave N for improper storage of junk and garbage (tree brush and concrete pieces) stored behind the yard of a home along Lake Charles Drive N.

Beltran observed a subject who had been warned multiple times in the past for open container violations, drinking multiple beers in public behind an alleyway located between two businesses. It was at this time that CPO Beltran issued an NTA/Ordinance Violation citation to the subject for an open container.

CPO Beltran issued a courtesy notice to a business for multiple ordinance violations for improper storage of junk, inoperable/unregistered vehicles and prohibited parking. Pending compliance.

CPO Beltran also covered the road for patrol during this month, as well as attending multiple meetings and planning/coordinating events.

CPO Beltran has been utilizing the Polaris, police truck and police bicycle during the duties of his patrol.

CPO Beltran continues to work on and update our current Business Watch List.
