## MARCH 2020 MONTHLY STATS

As the COVID-19 crisis continued to develop nation-wide in the month of March, our Department implemented best practices to train and educate, striking a balance between safeguarding our staff and delivering our same high standard of service. We also revised our Infectious Disease Policy to reflect current corona virus best practices, and ensured that appropriate PPE was inventoried and issued and replacement supplies ordered when possible.

The CP Unit as well as Patrol visited storefront businesses and restaurants in Town this month to educate regarding compliance with County and State health directives and social distancing guidelines. This initiative was also supported on our social media platform.

The Department continued to stay busy with patrolling and proactive crime prevention initiatives, staying highly visible during this time with no disruptions in service. Members of the Department responded to 106 calls for service in addition to proactively patrolling and maintaining a strong presence in residential and business districts.

Detective Tucker continued to follow up on those felony cases which are initiated by patrol and transfer over to his unit for investigation.

All Town Events were cancelled until further notice this month due to health concerns regarding the corona virus. This included our Community Policing Event, *Biking with a Badge*, which had been scheduled on the 23<sup>rd</sup> as a celebration of Florida Bike Month. Preparation for two Hurricane Preparedness seminars originally scheduled to be held at Community Hall and at Clearview Oaks' Martha Ward Pavilion were also postponed.

Most, if not all, county and state-wide meetings with other law enforcement partners were cancelled or postponed. *Operation Dry Streets*, a state-wide DUI Wolfpack in which we had two officers participating, was also postponed due to concerns about Corona virus, health priorities, and public safety.

Because scheduled events were cancelled, our community compliance / policing officer concentrated on crime prevention, ordinance complaints, and covering the road. Ofc Beltran made sure to use the Polaris and the police bicycle this month in order to be plainly visible during his patrol duties while maintaining social distancing.

He also worked with great results in the residential and business areas of our community addressing issues which are a concern (stat sheet attached).

# KCPD Community Policing & Code Compliance Stats March 2020 *AM*

The COVID-19 outbreak has affected our local businesses in many different ways, primarily financially. To do our part, the CP Unit joined forces with Patrol and we went to all of the restaurants located in the city so we could ensure they were up to date on the latest health directives and could voice any concerns directly to us. A post was created on social media, reminding our followers that these businesses were still open and ready to serve (take-out or pick-up only).

The *Biking with a Badge* event that was scheduled for March 23<sup>rd</sup> 2020 was canceled due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

CPO Beltran focused on common ordinance violations such as tall grass (Code 30-106), improper/prohibited storage (30-57), unregistered/inoperable vehicles (30-81), no permit pulled (18-1) and prohibited signage (snipe signs in right of way 66-194) for the majority of ordinance violations for this month.

CPO Beltran issued an NTA/Ordinance Violation citation for an open container.

CPO Beltran has been utilizing the Polaris, police truck and police bicycle during his patrol duties.

CPO Beltran continues to work on and update our current Business Watch List.
