APRIL 2020 MONTHLY STATS

The State and County extended the State of Emergency declared in March due to the COVID-19 pandemic through the entire month of April. Throughout the month, our Department continued to train and educate, striking a balance between safeguarding our staff and delivering the same high standard of service to all our stakeholders. We attended County and State virtual meetings, keeping up to date on current corona virus best practices and directives, and ensured that appropriate PPE was inventoried and issued and replacement supplies ordered when possible.

The CP Unit as well as Patrol continued to visit storefront businesses and restaurants in Town this month to educate regarding compliance with County and State health directives and social distancing guidelines. This initiative was also supported on our social media platform.

The Department continued to stay busy with patrolling and proactive crime prevention initiatives, staying highly visible during this time with no disruptions in service. Patrol, the Midnight shift in particular, increased the frequency of our *Third Watch* and *If I Were a Thief* crime prevention programs to protect businesses that were closed due to County and State shelter in place directives.

Members of the Department responded to 81 calls for service in addition to proactively patrolling and maintaining a strong presence in residential and business districts in addition to monitoring quality of life and well-being issues during this difficult time for all our residents and school-aged children who have been sheltering in place.

Detective Tucker continued to follow up on those felony cases which are initiated by patrol and transfer over to his unit for investigation.

All Town Events were cancelled until further notice last month due to health concerns regarding the corona virus. In April, these cancellations included our Community Policing Event, *Peeps with the Police*, an Easter egg hunt and celebration of spring, as well as our Hurricane /Severe Weather Preparedness seminars originally scheduled to be held at Community Hall and at Clearview Oaks' Martha Ward Pavilion the last week of the month.

Because scheduled events were cancelled or postponed, our community compliance / policing officer concentrated on crime prevention, ordinance complaints, and covering the road. Ofc Beltran made sure to use the Polaris and the police bicycle this month in order to be plainly visible during his patrol duties while maintaining social distancing.

He also worked with great results in the residential and business areas of our community addressing issues which are a concern (stat sheet attached).

KCPD Community Policing & Code Compliance Stats April 2020

All April events and meetings were canceled due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

I assisted in covering patrol and taking multiple calls for service this month. Continuing last month's community policing efforts, I also made contact with residents regarding wellbeing and quality of life issues during the corona virus lockdown. I was delighted to be asked to assist and participate in parades for several kids' birthday parties. All officers who were available formed parades with their marked vehicles, turned on sirens and lights, and participated in the festivities, which were created due to social distancing requirements.

Children and families in the neighborhood of 52nd Ave N and 59th St N created beautiful chalk art in their drive ways and down the block with positive messages for first responders. I and other officers arrived to make contact with residents to show appreciation and thanks for the kind messages and gestures. Pictures were taken and posted on social media.

I made contact with the owner of a business off of 66th St N that was having questionable work/construction done in the back. The business is now in compliance.

Three Daughters Brewing in St Pete and Dollar Tree donated gallons of hand sanitizer and cleaning supplies to the Police Department. Please refer to the PD's Facebook Page to see just some of the support we received from our community during this difficult time.

I have been working on following up on multiple criminal and ordinance cases.

I observed an increasing number of transient subjects congregating behind the vacant bank along 54th Ave N. I made contact with the property manager and informed him of the issue. The property manager completed a trespass



authorization form for the property, allowing officers to trespass subjects at the location who should not be there.

I have been conducting multiple business checks and directed patrols for essential businesses that have been targeted for theft within the month.

I observed multiple Semi-Trucks parked in empty lots at closed businesses and contacted the companies for the trucks to have them removed from the property. We continue to monitor the vacant business parking lots to ensure the overnight parking code is enforced.

I focused on common ordinance violations such as tall grass (Code 30-106), Improper/prohibited storage (30-57), unregistered/inoperable vehicles (30-81), No permit pulled (18-1) and prohibited signage (Snipe signs in right of way 66-194) for the majority of ordinance violations for this month.

I have been utilizing the Polaris, police truck and police bicycle during the duties of my patrol.

I continue to work on and update our current Business Watch List.
