## MAY 2020 MONTHLY STATS

During the month of May, the PD was operating under the State and County State of Emergency directives due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Governor's Phase 1 reopening plan was also implemented this month. Throughout the month, we continued to deliver the same high standard of service to all our stakeholders with no disruption in service, operationally or administratively.

Our Department continued to train and educate, keeping up to date with current developments, attending County and State virtual meetings, such as the Regional Accreditation Meeting for Tampa Bay hosted by USF, as well as many County-wide conference calls focused on safeguarding the health of our community. We also ensured that appropriate PPE was inventoried and issued to our personnel and replacement supplies ordered when possible.

The CP Unit as well as Patrol continued to visit storefront businesses and restaurants in Town this month to educate regarding compliance with County and State health directives and social distancing guidelines, including the Phase 1 reopening initiative.

The Department continued to stay busy with patrolling and proactive crime prevention, staying highly visible during this time with no disruptions in service. Patrol, the Midnight shift in particular, increased the frequency of our *Third Watch* and *If I Were a Thief* crime prevention programs to protect businesses that were closed or in the process of re-opening in accordance with County and State directives.

Members of the Department responded to 92 calls for service in addition to maintaining a strong presence in residential and business districts, monitoring quality of life and well-being issues during what remained to be a difficult time for all our residents and school-aged children who have been sheltering in place.

Detective Tucker continued to follow up on those felony cases which are initiated by patrol and transfer over to his unit for investigation. He was assigned 17 new cases this month, issued 8 subpoenas, and was able to close 6 cases.

All Town Events continue to be cancelled until further notice due to health concerns regarding the coronavirus. In May, these cancellations included our Community Policing Event, *Bike/Ped Safety Education Outreach*, a safety event and celebration of National Bicycle Safety Month, as well as our Hurricane Preparedness seminars.

The Police Department worked on our Annual Community Report to be printed next month, and we also worked with other Town departments to update our Emergency Action Guide for the 2020 storm season, to include an inventory of agreements and supplies.

All the Nursing Home Facilities and ALF's throughout the Town were visited by the Community Policing Unit to prepare for Hurricane Season. Contact information for administrators and secondary contacts were updated and facility evacuation level, whether a disaster plan was in place, number of residents, beds, and other details, were reviewed.

Because scheduled events were cancelled or postponed, our community compliance / policing officer concentrated on crime prevention, ordinance complaints, and covering the road. Ofc Beltran made sure to use the Polaris and the police bicycle this month in order to be plainly visible during his patrol duties while maintaining social distancing. He also worked with great results in the residential and business areas of our community addressing issues which are a concern (stat sheet attached).

# KCPD Community Policing & Code Compliance Stats May 2020

All May events and meetings were canceled due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

I assisted in covering patrol and taking multiple calls for services this month.

Together with other officers from the Police Department, I made contact with residents to assist and participate in parades for children's birthday parties to boost morale, strengthen community ties, and to set examples for social distancing. Officers rode in the parades, with their lights activated. Pictures were taken and posted for social media when possible.

This month I assisted in updating our Emergency Action Guide for 2020 by providing updated information for all Nursing Facilities and ALF's within the Town.

A new thrift store and restaurant has opened along 54<sup>th</sup> Ave N. I made contact with the owners and welcomed them to Kenneth City. I gave the owners my cards and directed them to call the non-emergency dispatch number if they have any issues. I also added the new businesses to our Business Watch Contact List, which I continue to work on and keep current.

Three Daughters Brewing and Dollar Tree donated gallons of hand sanitizer and cleaning equipment to the Police Department this month. I picked up the supplies, took pictures and sent them to be posted on social media so that we could publicly acknowledge these valuable local partnerships.

I am currently working on an Event with a local day care center for a "meet and greet" with the children about the Kenneth City Police Department and what it means to be a police officer.

I have been working on multiple civil-matters that require reports and documentation and have completed several trespass reports for businesses this month. I have also been updating Trespass Authorization Letters for the businesses within our Town.



I have been working on following up on multiple criminal and ordinance cases.

I have focused on targeting 54<sup>th</sup> Ave N and 66<sup>th</sup> St N for prohibited/non-permitted signage along the right of way. All snipe/lollipop and non-permitted signage has been removed.

I observed an increasing number of transient subjects congregating, loitering, panhandling, drinking and littering on the benches, shelters and signs along the PSTA Bus stops within our city. I reached out to PSTA, informed them of the issue and they completed a trespass authorization letter, granting authority to Kenneth City Police officers to trespass subjects who are at the PSTA Bus Stops littering, drinking, loitering, panhandling and not conducting businesses as a PSTA passenger.

I have been conducting multiple business checks and directed patrols for essential businesses that could be targeted for theft during this time when many have been closed and unattended.

I focused on common ordinance violations such as tall grass (Code 30-106), Improper/prohibited storage (30-57), unregistered/inoperable vehicles (30-81), No Permit Pulled (18-1) and Prohibited Signage (Snipe signs in right of way 66-194) for the majority of ordinance violations for this month.

I have been utilizing the Polaris, police truck and police bicycle during the duties of my patrol.
